If two people sign up for the same date, flowers can be placed in other locations in the Sanctuary, such as on the organ or piano or at the baptismal font. We do not have flowers at the altar during lent.

BIBLE STORIES IN WORSHIP AND SUNDAY SCHOOL

1/5/2020 - Jesus the Word - John 1:1-18

What's happening in this story? Central to this passage, and an ongoing theme in Luke's gospel, is the great and subversive activity of God. God in Christ arrives with the lowest profile possible: as a new baby. The glory of God's heavenly host of angels is revealed to nameless shepherds, who occupied the lowest place in society at the time and sat outside the city in dark fields. The announcement of the Messiah, and the grace of God's favor, is made to the outsiders.

What does this story mean for kids? Kids will likely have heard this story many times before. One place to focus is the shepherds. They hear from the angels while they are still in their fields and are charged to share the good news after seeing the baby Jesus. This seems so uneventful as we read it centuries later. At the time, however, choosing shepherds for this important task was remarkable. While they offered a needed service, they were not in a valued position. The shepherds offer an example of being able and willing to proclaim and praise regardless of what others think of them.

1/12/2020 - A Light to the Nations - Isaiah 42:1-9

What's happening in this story? Isaiah includes four texts that are often called "Servant Songs"—songs about God's "servant" and what the servant is supposed to do. This is the first of those four songs. The servant brings forth justice and teaches not only Israel, but all the nations of the earth. Isaiah often has a universal sensibility. The servant will bring about this justice nonviolently, with little noise or fanfare, and will not tire of this work. The justice he will enact is much like the traditional "works of mercy." Sometimes the servant is understood to be Jesus, sometimes the people Israel, and sometimes just a person devoted to God.

What does this story mean for kids? All ages may need assistance to understand this bit of poetry as a prophetic message that God is going to send a "servant" as a messenger. Kids may also only see this as a piece of history (that is, a prophecy about the coming servant) and not as scripture that can speak to them today. They may need help understanding this scripture as indicating that we can all embody the idea of the chosen servant.

1/19/2020 - The Lamb of God - John 1:29-42

What's happening in this story? John's ministry as the hinge prophet between the Old and New Testaments is illustrated in this story; he is the one who watches for the coming Messiah and then announces his arrival. Jesus mirrors John's actions by speaking, and when he speaks, inviting them to see. So there is this back and forth of seeing and speaking that is very important in this passage, both for who John is and as a theme that will continue in this gospel.

What does this story mean for kids? This passage can be difficult, as John is using a lot of rhetoric to say one thing: Jesus. So, while younger kids in particular might get hung up on the muddiness of the words, help them get to the center of the text: the idea that Jesus is the one John was getting people ready for—the one he, they, and we have been waiting for. Create opportunities for kids to point to Jesus, just like John did.

1/26/2020 - United in Christ - 1 Corinthians 1:10-18

What's happening in this story? Despite it being called "First Corinthians," this is not Paul's first letter to that community. He had ministered with them for a period of about eighteen months previously. In this text from chapter 1, we find something of a summary of much of Paul's message in the entire letter—unity in Jesus. It seems factions had developed among the Corinthian community, each with a different leader. Paul decried such party politics, emphasizing that the whole community was under the headship of Christ, not of Paul or Apollos or Cephas.

What does this story mean for kids? The simplest way to interpret this scripture is "don't fight." Younger kids can hear this easily. Older kids can talk about the things that divide us, with the emphasis that we should put those aside. Not arguing, and concentrating on our similarities instead of our differences, will also be a theme that resonates with older kids. They may have a "What? I have to get along with?" kind of moment.



ACOLYTE TRAINING

Has your child mentioned to you that he/she would like to be an acolyte and light the candles during the worship service? If not, now is the time to ask him/her. This is an excellent way for your child to begin their service to the church. It also helps them concentrate more on the worship service. Their responsibilities are to light the candles, receive the offering, and ring the big outside bell (call to worship).

On Saturday, January 11th at 10:00am, I will be training children interested in being an acolyte. Training usually takes about an hour. The requirements are that they must be 7 years of age or older, they must be tall enough to light the candles and you, as a parent, must think they can handle the responsibility. I schedule them the month before they are to acolyte and I <u>never</u> schedule them without contacting the parents...too many busy schedules. I usually do this by e-mail.
